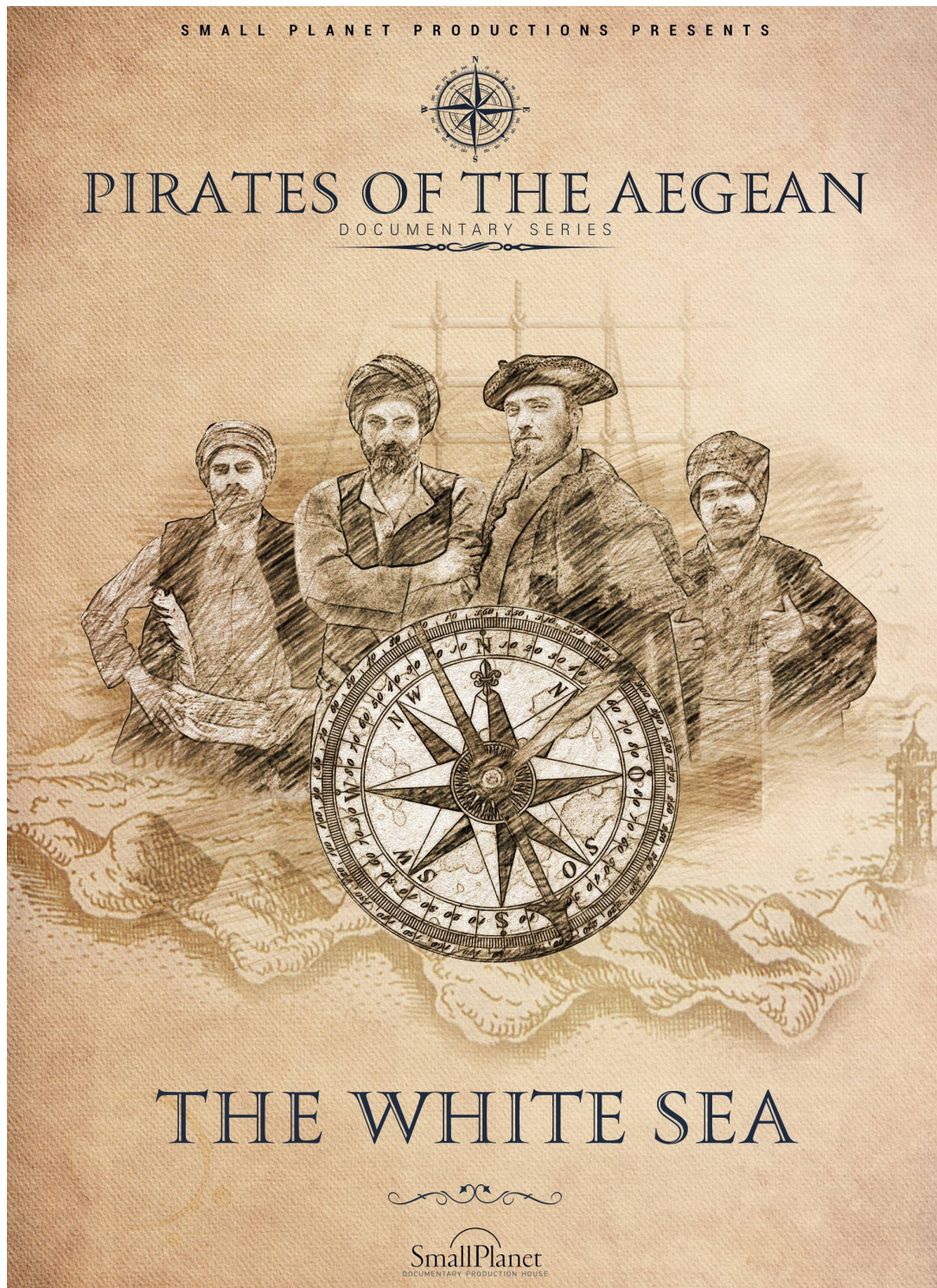


Episode 4:

## **SYNOPSIS**

The 17<sup>th</sup> century is the Golden Age of Piracy. The White Sea, as it was called by the Ottomans who couldn't control it, has become more dangerous than ever.

Ottoman pirates did the same, abducting a boy from a Naxos beach, who, having himself become a pirate, was appointed as a high-ranking Ottoman official. Creveliers himself seized Adam, who years later was the one who took his life.

In the White Sea, people's fates got sealed with salt and blood.
